Re: Support for Senate Bill 630 (Allen) - State Parks

Dear Assemblymember Papan,

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we write to express our strong support for SB 630 (Allen). There is a large backlog of projects currently on the California Department of Parks and Recreation (State Parks) acquisition list. Many of these lands were acquired at the bequest and with the support of State Parks and have been held by the undersigned land trusts for decades in anticipation of transfer to State Parks to complete existing parks for the benefit of all. This bill has several benefits:

- 1. It streamlines government processes and reduces costs.
- Focuses Department of General Services (DGS) and Public Works Board (PWB) on projects with large investments while allowing smaller and simpler State Parks acquisitions to advance more efficiently.
- 3. Clears the backlog of State Park projects.
- 4. Relieves burden on nonprofit partners.
- 5. Gives DGS authority to delegate when it deems appropriate.

In addition, these property transfers will help address the significant recreational use demands on our park lands and, in many instances, actually reduce the burden of managing State Park units by lowering or eliminating the operational complications of inholdings or incomplete parks.

SB 630 provides State Parks a way to acquire properties that are low to no cost and low risk. Currently, even the simplest transactions take multiple years and cost State Parks considerable expense for redundant reviews even though both State Parks and land trusts have experienced real estate professionals. Acquisitions that would require large commitments would still go through the PWB. These amendments to the Government and Public Resources Codes are critical if we are to be able to finally address the backlog of the majority of the projects on State Parks' acquisition list.

It is with this context that we also support the commitment of much-needed funding for State Parks from Prop 4. This was one of the main reasons why the undersigned land trusts and the California Council of Land Trusts provided significant support and advocacy for Prop 4.

This bill establishes a meaningful process for state parks to strengthen their existing parks with the acquisition of highly ecologically valuable conserved parcels. Because of this, the undersigned are motivated now more than ever to do all in their power to work with State Parks to facilitate the straight-forward low and no cost transfers of many of these projects into their ownership.

For these reasons, we respectfully request your support for SB 630 when it is heard in your committee.
